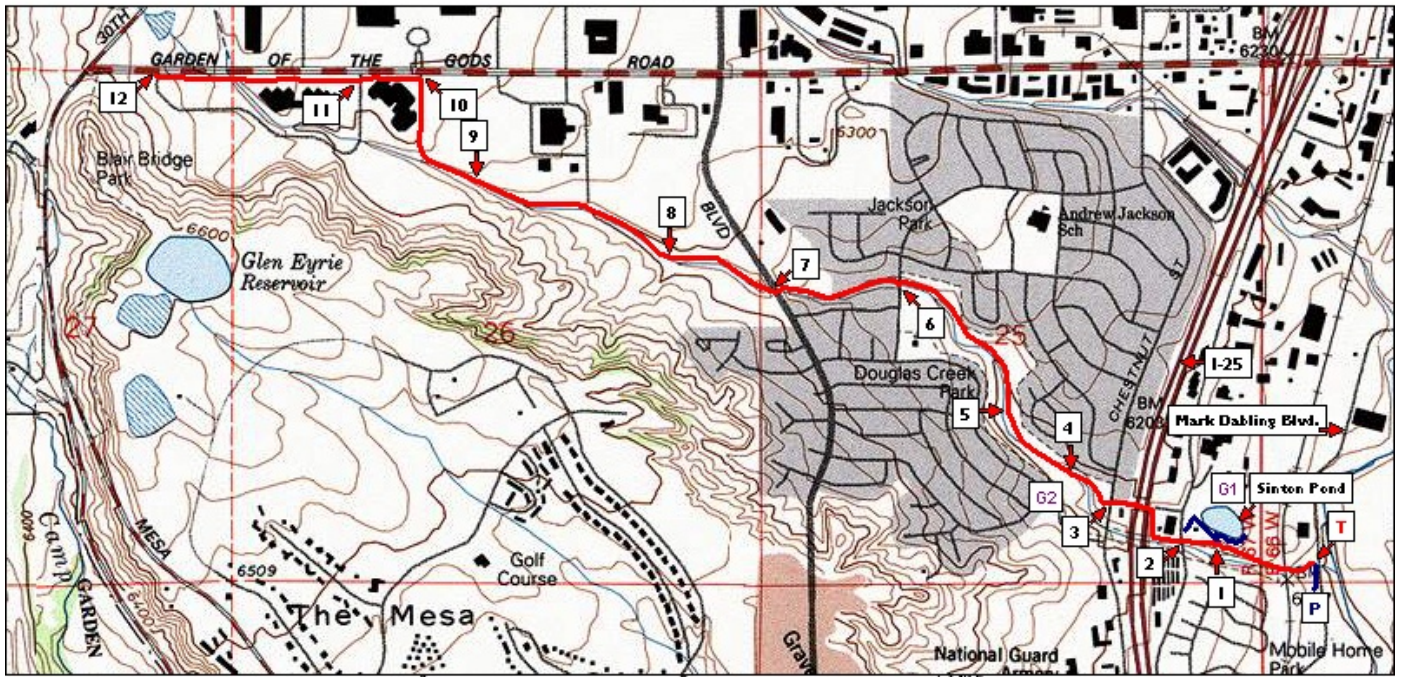

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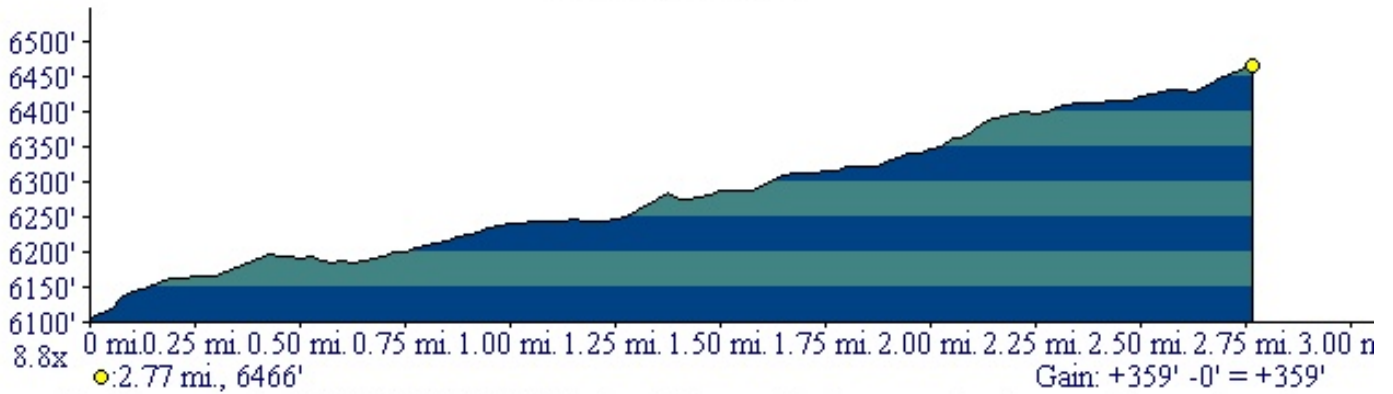

Trailhead Directions

From the I-25 in Colorado Springs, exit at Fillmore Street (Exit 145), head east (away from the mountains) for about .12 miles and turn left (north) onto Mark Dabling Blvd. Travel north on Mark Dabling Blvd. for about ½ mile and look for a parking lot, just past the softball fields on your left (west). Park here. The trailhead is down a short spur trail (~200 feet) going north from the parking lot., directly across the street from the playground. The trail begins here on your left.

Waypoint Log

- P @ 0.00 Mi.** - Park in the lot at the south end of the Goose Gossage softball fields (west side of street).
- T @ 0.00 Mi.** - Trailhead is located a few hundred feet north of the parking lot.
- 1 @ 0.20 Mi.** - Side trails (to the right) lead to Sinton Pond and to Sinton Rd.
- 2 @ 0.28 Mi.** - Go under Sinton Road and then under Interstate 25.
- 3 @ 0.48 Mi.** - Cross over Chestnut Street. This is a busy road, be very careful.
- 4 @ 0.58 Mi.** - Go under a large, overhead pipe.
- 5 @ 0.75 Mi.** - Side trail on the left (south).
- 6 @ 1.10 Mi.** - Cross over Holland Park Blvd.
- 7 @ 1.35 Mi.** - Go through a narrow (one-way) tunnel under Centennial Blvd.
- 8 @ 1.58 Mi.** - Bridge on the left crossing the drainage way, accessing neighborhood.
- 9 @ 2.00 Mi.** - Intel building is on the right (north) and a bridge crossing the drainage way is on the left (south).
- 10 @ 2.25 Mi.** - Trail intersects with Garden of the Gods Rd., take a left here (going west) and stay on sidewalk.
- 11 @ 2.38 Mi.** - Cross over Arrowswest Drive.
- 12 @ 2.77 Mi.** - Cross over Arrowswest Drive again. Trail ends here as of Fall 2005. Will eventually connect to 30th Street in about a ¼ mile.
